The Macmillan Primary Care Explore programme gives you the opportunity to enhance your knowledge of the cancer journey and provide you with a strong foundation in cancer care to benefit your practice and the wellbeing of your patients.

What?

Macmillan Primary Care Explore is a blended learning programme consisting of e-learning modules hosted on Macmillan's LearnZone site, support from online module facilitators via Q&As, discussions and real time webinar sessions, opportunities to network with peers, support from your own local mentor and a Best Practice sharing session on successful completion. In addition, delegates receive a welcome pack, downloadable workbook and a certificate of achievement on completion.

Who?

The target audience is qualified professionals working in a Primary care Setting. The programme will also accommodate both newly appointed and more established professionals wanting to gain further knowledge and skills to support Cancer patients and their families/carers. The programme is open to delegates from across the UK.

When?

Delegates typically complete the course within three months, although this can be much quicker depending upon hours available to study. You can access the programme from any device at a time that works for you.
